Course: *Challenges, Choices and Changes for 21st Century*

Elementary Educators

The course will help participants understand the challenges and changes that are prevalent in today's elementary classrooms and schools. Participants will learn strategies to deal with changes and to manage the conflict that change produces.

Topics will include instructional theories, classroom and behavior management techniques, community issues, student health issues, resources available for assistance, educational law, etc. This course shall address diverse approaches based upon behavioral, cognitive, affective, social and ecological theory and practice.
